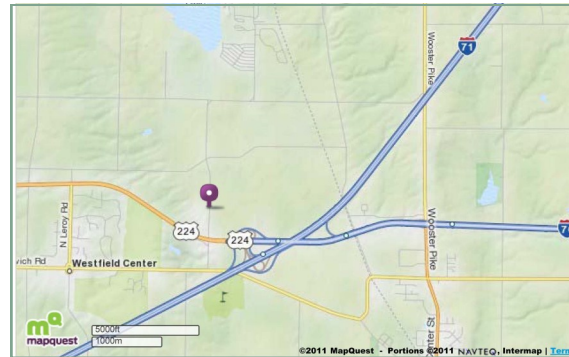

Composting in Ohio 2011: A tour of the industry

About the Sites

Join us for the day as we learn about alternatives, including composting and recycling, for converting waste materials to resources.

The **Medina County MSW Processing Complex** in Seville exercises "flow control" of all Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) generated in Medina County. We will visit three facilities that make up this complex:

- 1) The Central Processing Facility processes close to 600 tons of MSW each day, extracting over 30% in recyclable materials, including 50-60 tons of "fines" material, measuring 2 inches or smaller.
- 2) Ohio's only Ohio EPA Class I Compost Facility which composts the fines extracted from the MSW.
- 3) Medina County's Class IV Compost Facility, which processes yard trimmings and leaves to create a finished compost sold in bulk or bags.

Baldwin Wallace College, Berea, Ohio. As part of its commitment to embrace environmentally sustainable practices, in 2009 Baldwin Wallace purchased an Earth Tub composter to compost kitchen food scraps and campus yard wastes. The Earth Tub has been approved by the Ohio EPA as a Class II composting site. The Earth Tub has a capacity of 3 cubic yards and produces about three batches of finished compost yearly.



Rosby Resource Recycling in Brooklyn Heights, Ohio, operates a Class II composting facility, recycling organic wastes from its garden center and 12-acre berry farm as well as food scraps from local restaurants and grocers to create soils, mulches, and other products. In addition, Rosby reclaims construction and demolition debris from the Greater Cleveland area.
